### ***Migration, Environment, and Climate Change: Policy Brief Series***

**Audience:** Primarily external. *Migration, Environment and Climate Change: Policy Brief Series* contributes articles for policymakers working in the field of migration, environment and climate change adaptation policies.

**Main Objective:** The overall objective of *Migration, Environment and Climate Change: Policy Brief Series* is to contribute to the global knowledge base on the relationship between migration and environmental change, including climate change, and the formulation of related policy options. The journal provides reliable and precise information on the topic and identifies recommendations, good practices and lessons learned to harness the positive impact of migration in adapting to environmental changes.

**Volume:** 4-5 pages, not exceeding 3,000 words.

**Content:** The author prepares a document that focuses on emerging issues related to migration, the environment, and climate change in order to help clarify and understand complex issues. The author presents research results so they are easily accessible and comprehensible to policymakers. This document can also highlight and discuss innovative policy practices in order to promote the sharing of experience and broaden the political dialogue on these issues.

- f. Additional readings, key references and sources
