A panel discussion and public forum exploring efforts towards food security and sustainability

The world is facing a minimum of a three-year food security crisis, created or compounded by 3 'Cs': conflict, COVID-19, and climate. The effects of climate change already pose a serious challenge to agriculture, exacerbating the effects of food insecurity on communities worldwide. It is vital to explore innovative solutions for more sustainable interventions.

These solutions can involve making multi-faceted investments in food systems, including science and infrastructure, and facilitating stronger engagement with nontraditional actors like diasporas.

Join the U.S. Department of State's Office of Global Partnerships and the International Organization for Migration for the second event in this year's "Diaspora Voices" series. The event will explore diaspora efforts to foster food security and sustainability practices, and feature a panel discussion of diaspora experts.
